**TABLE I – LENGTH OF THE SCHOOL YEAR 2005/2006
(PRIMARY AND GENERAL SECONDARY EDUCATION)**

- ² **BELGIUM GERMAN-SPEAKING COMMUNITY:** The **teachers'** school year is similar to the students' school year but, since 2005/06, the head of institutions may require teachers to be present the last 5 working days of the month of August for certain non-teaching activities (exams, decisions in connection with the student's results, preparation of the new school year, etc.).
- ¹ **CZECH REPUBLIC:** According to the Labour Code, the holiday for **teachers** at primary or secondary level is 8 weeks each calendar year. They take it primarily in the time of school holidays.
- ³ **DENMARK:** *Folkeskoler* are at liberty to decide on the number of holidays and their distribution, provided they offer a minimum number of lessons in each subject. The Ministry of Education only determines the date of the last day of the school year. This is the case for both primary and general secondary education. 01 August is the earliest possible date to start, schools normally begin 1, 2 or even 3 weeks later.
- ⁴ **GERMANY:** In accordance with the *Hamburg Agreement* between the *Länder* on harmonisation in the school system, the school year begins on 01 August and ends on 31 July. The actual beginning and end depend on the dates of the summer holidays which vary from one year to the other.

- ⁵ **ESTONIA:** The Basic Schools and Upper Secondary Schools Act stipulates that an academic year shall start on 01 September and a study period shall include not less than 175 days of study (35 weeks). School holidays (and accordingly the end of the school year) are determined by a regulation of the Minister of Education for every school year.
The beginning and the end of a **teacher's** school year depend on the individual school and teacher. According to the legislation, **teachers** have 56 days (8 weeks) of vacation. Generally, they go on vacation in the middle of June and are back in the middle of August.
- ⁶ **GREECE:** Official school year: 01 September 2005 to 31 August 2006. Teaching school year: 12 September 2005 to 15 June 2006.

⁸ **FRANCE:** Certain schools have a 4-day-week. Only in these cases will the dates vary. Lessons will start on 23 August 2005 and end on 07 July 2006. **Teachers** have to begin on 1 September 2005.

⁹ **IRELAND:** In general, school commence on the 1 September provided it is a weekday. However, to ensure compliance with the agreed arrangements on the standardisation of the school year and the requirement at second level that school provide a minimum of 167 days tuition, it may be necessary, because of particular circumstances arising in the school year 2005/06, that some second level schools commence on the 30 or 31 August 2005.

¹⁰ **ITALY:** It is up to the *Direttori degli Uffici scolastici regionali* (school regional authorities) to decide the date of beginning of the school year. Starting from school year 2002/2003 also the date of end of the school year is decided by the Regions. That means that the school year can begin and finish at different dates, according to the decision taken at regional level. The *Direttore dell'Ufficio scolastico regionale* can decide for the same Region different dates of beginning and end, according to the school level. Generally speaking, the school year begins between the 2nd and the 4th week of September and finishes between the 1st and the 3rd week of June.

According to the implementation of school autonomy, the consultative councils of the schools can adapt the school calendar concerning the beginning and the end of the lessons. It means that the decisions of the *Direttori degli Uffici scolastici regionali* will be applied only in the case that schools have not decided their own dates of beginning and end. The school adaptations of the organisation of school time must guarantee at least 200 days of lesson a school year.

- ¹¹ **CYPRUS:** The official school year in **primary education** is from 05 September 2005 to 23 June 2006. The official school year for **general secondary education** is from 01 September 2005 to 31 August 2006. The school year includes registration days, sorting out of schools and classes and exam periods - both **primary** and **secondary** education. The school year is longer for **teachers** in both primary and general secondary education:

- ¹² **LATVIA:** The school year is divided in two semesters: the first from 1 September to 23 December and the second from 10 January to 31 May (or 09 June for the 9th class and 16 June for the 12th class). Extension of the school year for classes 1-8 and 10-11 may be made, if specific circumstances hindering education process arise during the school year (e.g. coldness, strike, emergency situation in school, etc.). The **teachers'** school year corresponds with student's year, but is normally longer and starts earlier, though the start and the end date is not defined officially. The employment status of teachers is contractual and determined by the labour law. Hence, teachers are engaged not just when classes are in operation, but also in periods during which schools are open for administrative reasons. In any case, the teacher has the right to receive 8 weeks of paid annual leave, commonly in summer.
- ¹³ **LITHUANIA:** It is within each school's discretion to decide what kind of activity pupils will be offered from 01 to 21 June: either disciplinary subject-based projects, subject/art weeks, work at the school library, visits to higher education schools, installing exhibition, visits to historic places, sports events, remedial courses for pupils not showing notable progress, etc. Pupils in the years 1 to 5 can finish only after at least 170 school days, while those in the years 6 to 11 after at least 195 days. These days include the national holidays. Pupils in the last year of upper secondary education finish their lessons on 25 May. The annual amount of leave for **teachers** is legislated as 56 calendar days. Normally, it is recommended that teachers take their annual leave during school summer holidays (i.e. teachers' leave is normally determined by the school calendar).
- ¹⁴ **HUNGARY:** The number of teaching days is 181, compulsory, for all institutions.

¹⁵ **MALTA:** 13 to 15 June 2006: secondary sector schools - oral examinations (annual examinations); 16 to 28 June 2006: Secondary sector schools annual examinations; 26 to 28 June 2006: Primary schools annual examinations. **Teachers** begin 22 September 2005 and end 12 July 2006 in Primary and general secondary education. 16, 19 and 20 September 2005 and 7, 10 and 12 July 2006 are INSET Days.

¹⁶ **NETHERLANDS:** The school year officially runs from 01 August to 31 July of the following year. Start and end of the teaching year is according to region (north, central and south region).

The **teachers'** school year is similar as students' school year. However, it is at the school's discretion to decide whether **teachers** are expected to end or start later (in order to attend meetings, for preparation of timetable, other non-teaching activities etc.)

¹⁷ **AUSTRIA:** Other *Länder*: Kärnten, Oberösterreich, Salzburg, Steiermark, Tirol, Vorarlberg. The **teachers'** school year is of the same length as the pupils' school year.

¹⁸ **POLAND:** End of the school year in both primary and secondary schools is always the last Friday of June. In the last grades of upper secondary schools ending with the Matura examination, however, the school year ends earlier, but the date has not yet been decided. In the last grades of gymnasium (lower secondary) ending with the external examination, the school year ends on 28 April 2006. In the last grades of basic vocational schools, ending with the external vocational examination, the school year ends on 14 June 2006.

In general, **teachers'** school year covers the same period of time as pupils' school year. Teachers' holidays, however, may be shortened by max. 7 days, if there is a need to perform organisational tasks in a given school.

¹⁹ **PORTUGAL:** After school year starts, classes can not be interrupted.

End of school year for general secondary education: For the 9th and 12th year between 9 and 23 June.

Teachers: Beginning (2005) 1 September and end (2006) 31 August. Teachers' holidays are, as for other civil servants, determined by the general regulation (Decree-Law n. 157/2001-11 May).

²⁰ **SLOVENIA:** The official length of the school year is from 01 September to 31 August, but lessons are completed in June.

Primary and lower secondary education:

End of the elementary school lessons (single structure of primary and lower secondary education):

15 June for the final grade pupils, external examinations run by the end of June;

23 June for pupils who are not in the final grade.

Upper secondary education:

End of the upper secondary school lessons:

20 January is the last day of lessons for students in the final grade of short vocational courses (2,5-year duration); final examination from 1 February to 28 February;

24 May end of lessons for students in final grade of other vocational, technical and general courses; final examinations in June and July;

23 June is the last day of lessons for upper secondary students who are not in the final grade.

Teachers' school year begins about 10 days before the pupils'/students' school year and ends some 14-21 days after the end of pupils' lessons. The precise length depends on the individually determined leave of a teacher (from 22 to 35 days) and his/her tasks and obligations allocated by the head teacher.

²¹ **SLOVAKIA:** Official school year: 01 September to 31 August.

Starting date of teaching in the school year 2005/2006 is 01 September 2005 and ends on 30 June 2006.

Following the Labour Code, **teachers** and **head teachers** have holidays in the length of 8 weeks per year. Usually, **teachers** work one week after beginning of summer holidays and one week before the beginning of the school.

²² **FINLAND:** The providers of basis education (municipalities, school boards of private schools) decide on the precise starting date of the school year and other possible short holiday periods, but the date of the last school day, as well as the length of the school year, are fixed. According to the Basic Education Act (628/1998), teachers and pupils have 190 school days in pre-primary, basic and voluntary additional basic education. The General Education Act (629/1998) does not regulate the length of the school year for upper secondary schools, but general education institutions mostly follow the practice of the basic education institutions.

²³ **SWEDEN:** The exact days vary on regional and municipality levels.

Students have 182 school days and **teachers** 194. Generally, **teachers** start around 10 August and finish around 12 June.

- ²⁴ In **ENGLAND AND WALES**, schools must be open for at least 380 half day sessions each school year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the local education authority (LEA) or school governing body. Although school holidays generally cover the same core periods, exact dates may vary between schools and authorities. In most cases, the school year runs from the first week of September to the third or fourth week of July. There is currently some movement towards the adoption of a standard school year which would be consistent year on year. A number of LEAs began to introduce this from 2004/05 and some are working towards introducing this model from 2005/06. However, the decision to adopt this new model remains at the level of the LEA or school governing body.
Length of the **teachers'** school year: Teachers are required to be available for 5 additional days. Schools normally schedule these within the school opening dates given in the table.
- ²⁵ In **NORTHERN IRELAND**, schools must be open for 190 days a year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the Education and Library Board or school governing body. Therefore school holidays may differ between boards and schools. The five Education and Library Boards, encouraged by the Department of Education, have set up a harmonisation scheme, which sets the core holiday dates on which no services (school transport and school meals) are provided. Schools do not have to set holidays within these dates, but they are strongly advised to do so. In addition, for the 2005/06 school year, schools may allocate up to four 'School Development Days' from within the 190 days. These four days are devoted to staff development and school improvement and the school is closed to pupils.
Length of **teachers'** school year: Teachers are required to be available for 5 additional days. These are scheduled by schools to take place outside but near to the dates given in the table.
- ²⁶ **SCOTLAND**: In Scotland, pupils attend school for 190 days a year.
The **teachers'** school year is longer by 5 in-service days, thus it is 195 days long.
- ²⁷ In **ICELAND**, compulsory education covers both primary and lower secondary education.
There are still a few small rural schools at compulsory level which operate for 8 ½ months.
Teachers work for 9 months.

- ²⁸ **NORWAY**: The teachers' school year is roughly the same as the students'. The weeks vary between different municipalities and counties, but it is required that the teaching covers a period of at least 38 school weeks and that it takes place within a period of 45 continuous weeks during a school year.
- ²⁹ **BULGARIA**: The length of the school year for the teachers is the same as for the students.
- ³⁰ **ROMANIA**: Beginning of the school year: In exceptional situations, depending on local climatic conditions and school's specificity, the structure of the school year can be modified at the request of schools approved by the local educational authorities (County School Inspectorates). Approval is given if the number of 36 weeks and 177 school days is maintained and all pupils may participate, without restrictions in national examinations.
- ³¹ **TURKEY**: For primary education and general secondary education, a school year must be not less than 180 days. A school year runs 9 months from September to June.
The length of the **teachers'** school year for primary and general secondary education is from 01 September 2005 to 11 June 2006.

- ¹ **DENMARK:** Not all schools start at the same date. 01 August is the earliest possible date to start school.
- ² **GREECE:** Official school year: 01 September - 31 August.
- ³ **SPAIN:** Each Autonomous Community officially starts and ends the school year on a fixed date within this period. Teachers begin on 01 September.
- ⁴ **UK-SCOTLAND:** There are no differences between primary and secondary schools, however, there are variances across the 32 local education authorities.
The earliest **start date** for the school year 2005/06 is 15 August 2005.

In the 2005/06 school year, all these days are on weekdays other than Saturday, so there will be 187 school days in all. School holidays may differ within one municipality so that pupils in different schools may have their school holidays at different times.

¹⁶ **SWEDEN:** The exact dates vary between the municipalities. There is a total of 178 schooldays and around 5 extra days when teachers work or undergo training and the students have no classes.

¹⁷ In **ENGLAND and WALES**, schools must be open for at least 380 half day sessions each school year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the local education authority (LEAs) or school governing body. Although school holidays generally cover the same core periods, exact dates may vary between schools and authorities. There is currently some movement towards the adoption of a standard school year, which would be consistent year on year. A number of LEAs began to introduce this from 2004/05 and some are working towards introducing this model from 2005/06. However, the decision to adopt this new model remains at the level of the LEA or

school governing body. The pattern of terms and holidays for the standard school year is two approximately seven-week terms before Christmas with a two week break between them, followed by four approximately six-week terms with a break around the first two weeks of April, irrespective of the timing of Easter.

¹⁸ In **NORTHERN IRELAND**, schools must be open for 190 days a year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the Education and Library Board or school governing body. Therefore school holidays may differ between boards and schools. The five Education and Library Boards, encouraged by the Department of Education, have set up a harmonisation scheme, which sets the core holiday dates on which no services (school transport and school meals) are provided. Schools do not have to set holidays within these dates, but they are strongly advised to do so. In addition, for the 2005/06 school year, schools may allocate up to four 'School Development Days' from within the 190 days. These four days are devoted to staff development and school improvement and the school is closed to pupils.

¹⁹ **UK-SCOTLAND:** School holidays are not fixed nationally, but by local education authorities, and may vary from one authority to another. Some schools start on Monday 09 January, some will have an in-service on Monday and students will return on the Tuesday.

²⁰ **ICELAND:** Autumn, Christmas, Winter and Spring holidays can vary on compulsory level according to a change in the compulsory school act from 2001. Pupils' holidays over the school year are never shorter than 15 weeks.

²¹ **TURKEY:** A school year is divided into two parts: at the end of a semester, there is a two-weeks' holiday called mid-school year holiday. The summer holiday is between June and September. Decisions on ending/starting semester dates are made by the Ministry.

In **ENGLAND and WALES**, schools must be open for at least 380 half day sessions each school year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the local education authority (LEAs) or school governing body. Although school holidays generally cover the same core periods, exact dates may vary between schools and authorities. There is currently some movement towards the adoption of a standard school year, which would be consistent year on year. A number of LEAs began to introduce this from 2004/05 and some are working towards introducing this model from 2005/06. However, the decision to adopt this new model remains at the level of the LEA or school governing body. The pattern of terms and holidays for the standard school year is two approximately seven-week terms before Christmas with a two week break between them, followed by four approximately six-week terms with a break around the first two weeks of April, irrespective of the timing of Easter.

School holidays in England and Wales are planned to take into account and cover other national public holidays.

In **NORTHERN IRELAND**, schools must be open for 190 days a year. The dates of school terms are not fixed nationally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the Education and Library Board or school governing body. Therefore school holidays may differ between boards and schools. The five Education and Library Boards, encouraged by the Department of Education, have set up a harmonisation scheme, which sets the core holiday dates on which no services (school transport and school meals) are provided. Schools do not have to set holidays within these dates, but they are strongly advised to do so. In addition, for the 2005/06 school year, schools may allocate up to four 'School Development Days' from within the 190 days. These four days are devoted to staff development and school improvement and the school is closed to pupils.
